Introduction

- * _Longfields is the proud recipient of financial and volunteer donations from local sorority, church and business organizations. Money is used to purchase materials for students to engage in virtual learning, with little disruption due to a lack of resources and supplies._
- * _HUB is an after school enrichment program that is funded by the State of Maryland. They have partnered with Longfields in order to provide students in grades 2-6 opportunities for enrichment through science, math, martial arts, art and reading programming. This gives students opportunities to apply learning to real world scenarios.
- * _By providing students with after-school programs, such as; The Good News Club, National Junior Honor Society, the Art Club, and ELO we are able to reinforce the academic goals identified in our School Performance Plan Addendum. These programs give students the opportunity to stay on track, gain assistance with instructional challenges and expand their learning to other areas._
