




The new Glenridge Middle School will...





### + PROS

- Compact footprint minimizes park impact
- Gym located on tennis court pad
- Tall dining/music volumes into grade
- Efficient 3-story academic wing
- Separate entrances for cars + busses

## - CONS

- 4-story building: access + supervision
- Solar orientation not ideal



#### + PROS


- Separation of academic wing and public spaces
- Dining commons and media connected but separate levels
- Learning stair @ media
- Views from academic wing
- Separate entrances for cars + busses

## - CONS

- Larger footprint may be in stream buffers
- Bus loop distance from main entrance
- Academic clusters not as defined





### + PROS

- Academic clusters oriented with contours
- Accommodates larger parking area
- Central combined dining/media commons
- Views from academic wings

### - CONS

- Single site entrance for cars + busses
- Gym lower level than field
- Academic wing proximity to commons




