The Substitute Teacher Academy II will provide a more detailed description of effective teaching using the work of Charlotte Danielson's *Enhancing Professional Practice: A Framework for Teaching* 2013 edition. Presenters will also integrate information and activities focused on Common Core State Standards (CCSS). As CCSS are infused in work, participants will acquire new instructional skills that bring CCSS into practice in the classroom. Part II will run August 4 through August 7. Both training sessions will be held at James Madison Middle School, located at 7300 Woodyard Road in Upper Marlboro, from 5p.m. to 8p.m.
