In this dashboard, Hanover presents responses to the 2020-2021 Current and Prospective Pre-K Parent Survey administered online to parents. See below for the total sample and respondent breakdown. In addition to aggregate results, this dashboard presents responses by school and parent type. Users may filter the data or segment the charts by additional respondents groups using the filters and chart segments in the header.

Using the Dashboard


The dashboard displays results for all survey questions organized thematically on each tab. Users may filter the data using the drop-down menus in the header section, or break down the charts by selecting a segment, to compare differences across various respondent groups and sub-groups.

When using the filters, note the following:

- Results will only be displayed for questions with a sample size greater than 10.
- · Tables display "***" in cells where data suppression is applied.
- Some charts display "Top 2" responses for scales (e.g., % "somewhat" or "completely satisfied").
- Click "Full Scale View" in the left-hand navigation pane to see the full breakdown of responses for all scale points.
- Some questions include an "i" icon so users can view additional display logic notes on hover.


















Which of the following are most important to you in a pre-kindergarten program with regards to social development? Please select all that apply.





Which means of transportation do you regularly use or plan to use to transport your Pre-K student to and from school?






Which of the following is the maximum amount of travel time you are willing to take to get to your child's school?






Which of the following aspects of parental engagement are most important to you? Please select all that apply.





Recommendations

Based on these findings, Hanover recommends that Prince George's County Public Schools:

Prioritize expansion of Pre-K at PGCPS schools in the Central region. Survey results suggest broad satisfaction with existing Pre-K offerings overall and specific academic content, especially in the Central region. Prospective parents in the Central region have more optimistic impressions of registration and preparation for full-day kindergarten and suggest a greater likelihood of enrolling. Building on initial success in a region with existing satisfaction and interest in enrollment will strengthen Pre-K at PGCPS schools as the program continues into its second year.

To align with expressed parental academic interests, emphasize the development of language skills and introductory literacy. Current parents and prospective parents prioritize the development of communication and literacy skills when considering enrolling their child in a Pre-K program. Continuing to emphasize in the classroom and in outreach to parents learning in this topic area will demonstrate the quality and benefit of participation in PGCPS's Pre-K program by aligning with expressed parental interests.

Identify ways to reduce parental confusion around the registration process, including additional communication around eligibility, clearer communication of steps required for registration, and more on-demand assistance for parents while completing the process. While parents report strong satisfaction with PGCPS's Pre-K program and communication to parents, many describe confusion and challenges in properly registering. Challenges include misunderstanding of eligibility requirements, inability to find registration/enrollment information on the PGCPS website quickly, or support from the PGCPS in answering questions or direct assistance in filling out registration forms. Additionally, prospective parents and parents who do not speak English at home suggest the greatest difficulty and dissatisfaction with the registration process.

Continue to pro-actively communicate at a teacher, school, and district level with parents in various languages. Parents who say English is not spoken at home are generally satisfied with existing communication from PGCPS, feel informed about their child's academic progress, and report having sufficient access to resources in their preferred language. Continuing to promote access to these resources and expanding access in other components of Pre-K programming, including pro-actively providing information during registration/enrollment, will best align with expressed parents' interests and help effectively inform all parents.
