Reminders

- Students should be in full uniform daily.

Learning Focus

Reading/ Language Arts

- Letter-Sound Relationships
- Beginning Sound Isolation
- Phoneme Blending
- Letter Identification
- Students will ask and answer questions about key details in a text.
- Students will retell familiar stories, including key details.

Social Studies

- Students will learn how families are alike and different, and culture?
- What is history? And who are American Heroes?

Science

- Students will learn to compare and contrast features among different types of plants.

Math

- Recognizing numbers 1-10
- Write and recognize written symbols and quantities for at least 0-10.

Math Continued...

- Students compare numbers 0–10 using the words *greater than*, *less than*, and *equal to* by matching and counting.
- Use objects or drawings to compose or decompose numbers 1 through 10.
- Record decompositions through writing and drawing.
- Find all of the combinations that make 10, for any number 0 through 10.



Health

- Students will learn how the five senses can help students learn and live, and how they can provide protection

Reading At Home

Sound Scavenger Hunt

Choose a letter sound, then have your child find things around your house that start with the same sound.

Letter Scavenger Hunt

Make identifying letters a blast! Pick a letter and while out and about have students identify letters.



Math At Home

Show More Show Less

For this activity, you may need to make piles of different items on the table, which could be snacks or toys. Just make sure to pile one with less and one with more. Then, ask your child to observe the items and have your child tell which pile has fewer items and which has more.

Counting Snacks

For a yummy mathematics treat, assemble a pile of your child's favorite snack. Choose something small, such as jellybeans, gummy bears, etc. Give a snack to your child and tell them to count aloud. Give or take away some snack to show different numbers up to 10.
