Learning Focus



Reading/ Language Arts

- Letter-Sound Relationships
- Beginning Sound Isolation
- Phoneme Blending
- Letter Identification
- Students will ask and answer questions about key details in a text.
- Students will retell familiar stories, including key details.

- Students will learn the roles and responsibilities of citizens.

Math At Home

Shape Scavenger
